Summary: Summary for 1/12/2021 Version

This measure adds a new section to state statute which allows a medical provider to request an exemption from the department of health and human services to the limitations on THC content in medical marijuana on behalf of a qualifying patient.

This measure is applicable to physician dispensing of THC to applicable patients.

This measure provides that a health care provider will not issue written certification for nor an alternative treatment center dispense, deliver, or otherwise transfer to a qualified patient under 21 years of age, marijuana that has a tetrahydrocannabinol (THC) potency, by weight or volume, of greater than 10 percent in the final product. However, a provider may certify such qualified patient for marijuana with any potency of THC, if the qualified patient is diagnosed with a terminal condition and the provider indicates such on the written certification. A provider may request an exception to the THC concentration limits established in this measure electronically on a form created by the department of health and human services.

The Department of Health and Human Services will approve the request within 14 days after receipt of the complete documentation. The request will be deemed approved if the department fails to act within 14 days.

If enacted, this measure takes effect after 60 days.
