Summary: Summary of 10/12/2021 Version

This measure will not require all physician-administered drugs or medications to be dispensed by a pharmacy or affiliated pharmacy under an individual's health benefit plan.

In this measure, a health benefit plan may not require that physician-administered drugs or medications be dispensed by a pharmacy as a condition of coverage. It may not limit the coverage for a physician-administered drug. It may not cover the drug or medication at different benefit tiers or with any cost-sharing requirements that may impose greater expenses for a covered individual if it can be administered in an outpatient setting.

"Physician-administered drug or medication" means an outpatient drug, other than a vaccine, that cannot reasonably be self-administered by the patient to whom the drug is prescribed.

"Affiliated pharmacy" means a pharmacy that controls, is controlled by, or is under common control with a pharmacy benefit manager.

This measure does not list an effective date.
